

Colorado Statewide Food Insecurity Survey

This survey was conducted online among 565 Coloradans from Dec. 16, 2020 -Jan. 4, 2021. Respondents were identified via an online panel recruiting firm and were compensated for their time and participation. The overall sample has a margin of error of +/- 4.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. The data reflects the demographics of the Colorado Census and American Community Survey.
