

Colorado Statewide Food Insecurity Survey

This survey was conducted online among 502 Coloradans from June 23-July 6th, 2020. Respondents were identified via an online panel recruiting firm and were compensated for their time and participation. The overall sample has a margin of error of +/- 4.4 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. The data has been weighted by gender to better reflect the demographics of the Colorado Census and American Community Survey. The survey was conducted with the support of Kupersmit Research, Hunger Free Colorado's long-time survey research partner.
